Impact of Financial Aid

Students attending JCC as Title IV (Federal Funds) financial aid recipients who withdraw from all of their classes during the first 60% of the semester will be subject to an adjustment of Title IV funds. This U.S. Department of Education calculation may result in the student owing the College.

Any student that is receiving financial aid, which includes all loans, grants and scholarships, should

consult the financial aid office prior to dropping any classes.

Check which fits your situation:	Include this documentation:
<input type="checkbox"/> Death of an immediate family member (spouse, child, parent, or legal guardian of the student).	Obituary or death certificate which includes your relationship to the deceased.
<input type="checkbox"/> Return to work/change in working hours that occurred after the semester began and that substantially interferes with your ability to attend class. We will make every effort to find options for you to complete the semester before considering a refund.	Your employer must provide a letter of support on official company letterhead specifying exactly how your change in work interferes with your ability to attend class. The letter must be signed by your supervisor or higher company manager.
<input type="checkbox"/> Medical: Provide a doctor’s letter that your condition or injury prevents you from completing classes.	The statement must be on the physician’s letterhead and include expected start and end dates of the medical condition. The doctor must verify in the statement that you cannot attend any class as the medical condition is very serious and prevents you from participation in employment, education, and other major life activities for the duration of the semester.
<input type="checkbox"/> Call to military duty.	Submit a copy of your military orders with dates.

Refund Options

1. Cash or Refund to Source of Payment

Note: Percentages of course times are based on calendar days. Go to e-Services, “Drop Classes” then click to the matrix of dates for each course section.

Time Frame	Amount of Payment Refund
Before the end of the first 10% of your course	100% Tuition and Course Fees and 50% of Student Fees
From 11% to 25% of your course	75% of Tuition and all fees
From 26% to 40% of your course	50% of Tuition and all fees
From 41% to 60% of your course	25% of Tuition and all fees
After 60% of your course	No Refunds

2. Refund Scholarship Option

At any time, if you meet the W-exception and refund criteria, you may choose to have 100% of your tuition and fees used toward courses taken at JCC within the next calendar year. If you choose this option, the Refund Scholarship can only be used on JCC courses and cannot be refunded in the form of cash at any point.

Choose one option for refunds:

- “I choose to take my refund as a scholarship to be used only toward tuition and fees at Jackson Community College during the next calendar year. I understand that the Refund Scholarship provides me a full, 100% refund at any time during the semester that I withdrew, but in the form of a scholarship that cannot be transferred to cash at any point, cannot be transferred to another person, and is not eligible for further W-exception and refunds.”
- “I choose to take my refund in cash or refunded to the source of payment according to the Refund Schedule listed above, based on my withdrawal dates.”
