

Leadership Council Prior Meeting Review 12.08.21

The Leadership Council met on Wednesday, December 8th, 2021 to consider agenda items.

The meeting question discussed by the group was: If Jackson College closed its doors today, would our community miss us, or would they simply just get their education from someone else without skipping a beat? Relatedly, **How do we make Jackson College irreplaceable?**

Jet's Protocol Items included discussion regarding a new Emergency Assistance Program for students. It was determined that, as part of making Jackson College Hunger-Free, and rather than adding a new program, which could create confusion, it was determined that coupons for \$10 (for food or beverage purchases only, for use at Jet Fuel, Hospitality, and the Jet's Store (for food)) would be a better strategy. Coupons will be created and distributed to all employees for use with students when they witness students who are hungry, under stress, or having other difficulties.

A second action included the approval of a Student Service Specialist position to fill a vacancy.

A final action included the posting of the College's University Transfer Liaison position needed to fill a vacant position.

Policy reviews considered the Sexual Discrimination/Harassment policy with all changes agreed to. The GED Tuition Grant policy was reviewed and advanced without change. The Student Vaccination Policy was reviewed and advanced with all changes noted and agreed to.

Talent employment consideration included Jody Watson, a proposed Dining and Culinary Services Frontline Worker. Following the interview, she was advanced to HR/Talent for further evaluation.
