FIRST TEAM NORMS

The Leadership Council COVID-19 Commitments were reviewed.

MONTHLY BELIEF/GOOD NEWS

Celebration of the monthly belief and good news stories were shared.

MINUTES

The minutes for September 17, 2020 were approved with a few minor corrections.

ACTION ITEMS

JPEC Navigator

Jeremy Frew shared a protocol to move one of our current navigators to focus on JPEC students. The request was approved.

SCC Grant

Jason provided an update on the SCC Grant. Discussion was had to ensure clarity around this project. If the grant is received, then a point person for the grant will be designated.

Policy Review: 1715 Tobacco Free

Policy 1715 Tobacco Free was approved with proposed changes.

Resident Coordinator

Darrell presented a proposal to post for a Resident Coordinator. The request was approved.

Scorecard Review

The team reviewed the weekly Scorecard.

Housing Update

Darrell provided an update on housing. We are currently at 207 students in housing. Discussion was had around ensuring students in housing are going through the daily check point.

President Phelan asked Jim to get an update on the kiosks that have arrived. Jim will follow up with President Phelan with an update.

Tiny Homes

Jim provided an update on tiny homes. Homes are scheduled to arrive on Tuesday. Darrell shared that he is still finalizing selection protocols with legal for tiny homes and will have soon. A small event will be planned with a limited group of people, likely the beginning of November. An update on tiny homes will be a continuing item under housing each week.

FEMA

President Phelan inquired about the FEMA grant and where we are with expenditures we can submit for reimbursement. President Phelan would like us to ask for recovery on housing we supplied to emergency workers. Reimbursement for the emergency trailer being purchased will be pursued.

Restricted Funds

Darrell will pursue recovery of laptops not returned through the State. Additional items being allocated are PPE and barriers. Darrell will look into marketing expenses to see if they are eligible for reimbursement. Restricted funds update will be carried over to the next agenda. President Phelan made it clear that he does not want to return any dollars to the state.

For FY 21, President Phelan wants to stay on track to purchase laptops that will be part of enrollment for new students. Students will have the opportunity to opt out if they already have a device. Faculty will be required to include the minimum device needed on their syllabi.

Cares Act

Darrell provided an update on Cares Act.

Jim shared that he is working on finalizing the plan for winter.

Round Table

President Phelan is thinking about a long-term college that is predominately virtually but would offer some drive-in services. Lee is also working on a proposal to expand RSJ to 100.
