



## Articulation Agreement

Walden University  
and  
Jackson College

In the spirit of academic cooperation, and in order to facilitate the seamless transfer of credit between institutions, this Articulation Agreement is made between Jackson College and Walden University and dated this 30th day of May, 2023 (the "Agreement").

### I. PARTIES

A. Walden University



Walden University has supported working professionals in achieving their academic goals and making a greater impact in their professions and their communities. The university provides students with an engaging educational experience that connects them with expert faculty and peers around the world.

Walden offers bachelor's, master's and doctoral degrees online. Areas of study include health sciences, counseling, human services, management, psychology, education, public health, nursing, and public administration. B. Jackson College



Jackson College offers quality, transformational educational opportunities to prepare students for today's career fields or transfer to a university. The College is committed to student success, with expert faculty, academic support, and student services. Jackson College has been accredited by the Higher Learning Commission since 1933 and offers 48 associate degrees, certificate programs, and transfer options to Jackson County and Michigan residents.

### II. PURPOSE

This Agreement outlines the transferability of courses from Jackson College to programs at Walden University and the terms and conditions for partner/client organization participation. Specific program-to-program transfer pathways are set forth in Section III below and included in the Addendum of this Agreement.

### III. TRANSFER PATHWAY(S)

1. Walden University is regionally accredited; all academic course work in which a student has earned a grade of "C" or higher is fully transferable based on the attached transfer pathways or as determined by the registrar of Walden University.

2. Students enrolling at Walden University are eligible to transfer up to 135 quarter credit hours (90 semester credits) toward a bachelor's degree, including up to 90 quarter credits (60 semester credits) from sources approved by accrediting bodies recognized by CHEA or the US Department of Education. These sources include but are not limited to CLEP, DANTES, ACE, and prior learning portfolios -- providing the learning experience meets the standards of the university, is comparable to content offered by the university, and is appropriate and applicable to the university's programs.
3. **Based on the transfer tables attached in the Addendum, and stated policies of the university,** Walden guarantees transferability of all credits outlined in the following Jackson College (degrees/certificates) to the corresponding Walden University degrees:

**Jackson College AAS Nursing to Walden University BS in Nursing**

**Jackson College AAS Nursing to Walden University BS in Nursing - AIM**

**Jackson College AAS Nursing to Walden University MS in Nursing – Nurse Practitioner**

**Jackson College AAS Nursing to Walden University MS in Nursing – Specialty Practice**

#### **IV. TERMS AND TERMINATION**

1. Because of this agreement to articulate, and provided the individual identifies Jackson College by inquiring through the dedicated information channel provided to Jackson College, a ten percent (10%) tuition reduction is available to eligible students, alumni, faculty and other employees of Jackson College. This tuition reduction is applicable as of the date this Agreement is fully executed by the parties below and remains in effect for the duration of the student's continuous enrollment at Walden. No tuition credit or refund shall be made retroactively for any eligible student already enrolled at Walden University on the date of execution of this Agreement; however, the tuition reduction shall be applied to such eligible employees or alumni for course enrollments following the execution of this Agreement. Tuition reductions are applicable to tuition only and do not apply toward books, materials, and other supplies or fees needed for a course. Failure to facilitate communication through dedicated channels may result in not being eligible for the Tuition Benefit. Programs offered at military tuition assistance levels are not subject to this reduction.

Walden University may change its tuition rates at any time at its sole discretion and the reduction will be calculated based on the current tuition in effect for the applicable academic term for the enrolled program. Eligible employees, faculty and students and alumni shall not be entitled to any other reduction and are subject to all other admission and continuation requirements as set forth in the respective Walden University policies and catalogs.

*\*\*The Family Nurse Practitioner specialization in the MSN program is excluded from this tuition reduction. Walden may change the tuition reduction offered hereunder at any time, but such change will not affect the tuition reduction for students who are currently enrolled at Walden and using the existing tuition reduction. All tuition reductions, grants, or scholarships are subject to specific eligibility requirements.*

2. This Agreement will automatically renew on the last day of the month, three years from the date that it is executed, unless terminated by either party in writing. Should any changes to the Agreement be required, it will be necessary to follow the process outlined in V(F). Either party

may terminate this Agreement for any reason with 90 days written notice. Such termination shall not affect the rights of any students participating in any program under this Agreement prior to receipt of such notice. This Agreement will terminate automatically in the event that either party fails to maintain its accreditation status.

## **V. OTHER PROVISIONS**

- A. Admission to Walden University. Participation in the Agreement does not guarantee any Jackson College student or employee admission to Walden University. Potential students must apply in accordance with the procedures set forth by the University from time to time.
- B. FERPA. For purposes of this Agreement, pursuant to the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act of 1974 (FERPA), Walden and Jackson College will only be permitted to exchange student information with an appropriate release provided by the student. A sample of such release is attached hereto as Attachment A.
- C. Confidential Information. Walden and Jackson College acknowledge that, during the term of this Agreement and in the course of performing their obligations hereunder, they may disclose to each other certain confidential information and trade secrets relating to their respective past, present and future research, data, business strategies, marketing plans, development and business activities, designs, computer programs and code, systems, customer lists, personnel, student and financial information (“Confidential Information”).

Walden and Jackson College agree that, until such time as the Confidential Information enters the public domain through no fault of their own, they will never, directly or indirectly, use, disseminate, or disclose, any of the Confidential Information disclosed to one of them by or on behalf of the other without the prior written consent of the party to whom the Confidential Information belongs, except as may be required in the course of performing their respective obligations under this Agreement or as required by applicable public records law.

Walden and Jackson College agree to protect the Confidential Information from use or disclosure using no less than a reasonable degree of care. Upon expiration or termination of this Agreement, or upon the other party’s request, Walden and University Name agree to return to the other party to whom the Confidential Information belongs all copies of Confidential Information, and all drawings, documents, records, notebooks, disks, tapes, data residing or recorded in electronic media, and all other representations of Confidential Information, whether prepared by Walden, Jackson College, or others.

- D. Enforcement. Jackson College and Walden University are the only Parties to this Agreement and are the only Parties entitled to enforce its terms. Nothing in this Agreement gives, or is intended to give, or shall be construed to give or provide any benefit or right, whether directly, indirectly, or otherwise, to any third person not a party to this Agreement.
- E. Non-Exclusivity. Jackson College and Walden University reserve the right to enter into similar agreements with other institutions.

- F. Review Cycle. Jackson College and Walden University agree to review the Agreement every three years on the anniversary of its signing, unless either party gives notice to the other at an earlier time that modifications or changes have occurred. In the event that changes to the Agreement are required, those changes will be updated in an Addendum that will be attached to the Agreement and signed by both parties.
- G. Notice. Any notice required hereunder shall be sent by certified or registered mail, return receipt requested and shall be deemed given three (3) days after deposit thereof in the U.S. mail (postage prepaid).
- H. Curriculum Review. This Articulation Agreement is based on the current curriculum of both educational institutions. Each institution is responsible for notifying the other of any substantive changes to the curriculum. This agreement shall be reviewed by both institutions every three (3) years.
- I. Trademarks. The parties grant to each other a limited non-exclusive, non-transferable license to use each other's trademarks and servicemarks in furtherance of the articulation coordination detailed herein or in a manner solely for the purpose of identifying and communicating the existence of the relationship to Jackson College students, faculty, staff, and alumni. Use of trademarks, servicemarks and logos will comply with use policies of the originating institution. The parties shall discontinue the use of the licensed marks and return any and all files and materials containing the licensed marks supplied by the owner at termination or expiration of the Agreement. Neither party grants to the other any permanent or exclusive interest in the other party's trademarks. Should either originating institution request, in writing, that a particular use of the originating institution's trademarks and/or servicemarks be discontinued, the non-originating institution shall cease and desist such use of the trademarks and/or servicemarks.
- J. Agreement to Communicate. Jackson College agrees to regularly communicate to students, alumni, faculty and staff via mutually acceptable formats, and to host Walden representatives on campus for recruitment activities during the academic school year.
- K. Understanding of the Parties. This Agreement sets forth the entire understanding of the parties hereto and supersedes any and all prior agreement, arrangement and understandings, oral or written, of any nature whatsoever, between the parties with respect to the subject matter hereof.
