

Associate in Arts (ARTS.AA) to Bachelor of Science in Public Health at Wayne State University

The Bachelor of Science in Public Health is available to JC students who earn the Michigan Transfer Agreement (MTA), complete the WSU Expected Public Health Pathway Courses and finish one of the Associate Degree programs listed in the Health Sciences and Human Services Pathway (Public Health) with a cumulative GPA of 2.5 or higher.

Under this agreement, Wayne State University will waive the 60-hour-rule and require that a minimum of 35 credits be completed in courses offered by WSU. This allows students to complete up to 85 credit hours at Jackson College, and have those hours applied toward their bachelor's degree.

Additional courses must be taken so that total degree equals 60 credits. Visit a student success navigator to obtain a guide sheet and/or to discuss requirements for your selected program of study. Students are encouraged to choose courses that transfer as equivalent credit to four-year colleges and universities. Students are responsible for verifying that courses taken meet the requirements for their chosen

program of study.

Students can complete up to 85 transferrable credits.

Once 60 credits are met, students can complete an additional 25 credit hours to transfer into Wayne State University.
